Monroe Voters Should Not Vote on Lemon Township Issue 9

Hamilton - The Butler County Board of Elections is alerting voters living in the City of Monroe not to vote on Issue 9, which may appear on their ballots. Issue 9 is the Lemon Township Public Safety Levy, which applies only to residents of Lemon Township living outside the City of Monroe.

Lemon Township includes most of the city of Monroe and unincorporated areas to the south and southwest of the city. Voters in eight of the nine Monroe city precincts are eligible to vote for Lemon Township trustee. However, Issue 9 applies only to residents living in the unincorporated area of Lemon Township.

The issue was erroneously included on ballots in Monroe city precincts that also vote on Lemon Township trustee races. Any votes cast on Issue 9 by voters in Monroe precincts will not be counted and the issue will not affect any taxes for city residents.

The Board of Elections is posting notices in all absentee ballots, voting units and at polling places on Election Day notifying voters affected of this error.

Election Day is next Tuesday, November 3. Polls are open from 6:30am to 7:30pm. Voters are encouraged to check their polling locations on the Board of Elections website at butlercountyelections.org before heading out to the polls on Tuesday.

The Board of Elections remains open for in-person early voting this week. Hours are from 8am – 7pm daily and on Saturday from 8am – 4pm, Sunday from 1pm – 5pm, and Monday, November 2, from 8am – 2pm.

Voters also may request an absentee ballot by mail by mailing an application to the Board of Elections at 1802 Princeton Road, Suite 600, Hamilton, OH 45011. The Board of Elections must receive any applications to vote by mail by noon on Saturday, and all ballots must be returned with a postmark by Monday, November 2, or delivered in person to the Board office by 7:30pm on Election Day.
