SPECIAL ELECTION FOR SOUTHWEST LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT
(MORGAN TWP 1) AUGUST 2, 2016

EXTENDED HOURS OFFERED TO VOTERS

The Butler County Board of Elections will be open for Early Voting will begin on Wednesday, July 6th at 8:00 a.m. for voters wishing to vote in person prior to the Special Election on August 2, 2016.

The Board will be offering voters the following hours for in-person early voting for the election:

Wednesday, July 6, 2016 through Friday, July 8, 2016	8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
Monday, July 11, 2016 through Friday, July 15, 2016	8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
Monday, July 18, 2016 through Friday, July 22, 2016	8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
Monday, July 25, 2016 through Friday, July 29, 2016	8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
Saturday, July 30, 2016	8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
Sunday, July 31, 2016	1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.
Monday, August 1, 2016	8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

3.) Voters written request for an Early Voting Ballot MUST include the following information:

- Name and current address
- Date of Birth
- Mailing address for the ballot, if different than current address
- **One Form** of Identification:
 - last four digits of your social security number
 - driver's license number
 - copy of a current and valid photo ID
 - current utility bill (including cell phone bill)
 - bank statement
 - government check
 - paycheck
 - Other government document that includes the voter's name and address.
- The Election (Special) in which you intend to vote and the Election date (August 2, 2016).
- A statement indicating voter is a qualified elector,
- Voter's signature.

Ballots Returned by Mail

Ballots returned by U.S. mail must be postmarked no later than Monday, August 1, 2016, and must be received by the Board of Elections no later than August 12, 2016, ten (10) days after the Election. Ballots may be delivered in person by the voter or voter's family member to the Board office by close of polls (7:30 p.m.) on Election Day.

Early Voting Ballots may **not** be returned to a polling location on Election Day.

Out-of-country *Civilian and Uniformed Armed Service* ballots must be received by the Board of Elections by August 12, 2016 ten (10) days after the election to be counted.

If a voter or voter's minor child is hospitalized due to a medical emergency on Election Day, you should contact the Board of Elections. Voters with such an emergency may apply for an absentee ballot until 3:00 p.m. on Election Day.
