HAMILTON, OH: The Butler County Board of Elections will be open for early voting beginning Tuesday April 10th, at 8:00 a.m. for voters wishing to vote in person prior to the Primary Election on May 8, 2018.

The Board will be open for in-person early voting during the following hours:

Monday through Friday beginning April 10, through April 27,	8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
Monday, April 30, through Friday, May 4,	8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
Saturday, May 5, 2018	8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
Sunday, May 6, 2018	1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.
Monday, May 7, 2018	8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

In-person early voting will be open only at the Board of Elections office, 1802 Princeton Rd. Conference room C, Hamilton, Ohio 45011. See the end of this release for driving directions.

Voter's written request for a vote-by-mail ballot MUST include the following information:

- Name and current address
- Date of Birth
- Mailing address for the ballot, if different than current address
- **One Form** of Identification:
 - last four digits of your social security number
 - driver's license number
 - copy of a current and valid photo ID
 - current utility bill (including cell phone bill)
 - bank statement
 - government check
 - paycheck
 - Other government document that includes the voter's name and address
- The election (Primary) in which you intend to vote and the election date (May 8, 2018)
- The party ballot which you want to vote, Democratic, Republican, Green or issues only
- A statement indicating voter is a qualified elector
- Voter's signature

Ballots returned by mail must be postmarked no later than Monday, May 7, 2018, and must be received by the Board of Elections no later than May 18, 2018, ten (10) days after the election. Ballots may be delivered in person by the voter or voter's family member to the Board office by close of polls (7:30 p.m.) on Election Day.

Vote by mail ballots may **not** be returned to a polling location on Election Day.

Out-of-country Civilian and Uniformed Armed Service ballots must be received by the Board of Elections by May 18, 2018, ten (10) days after the election to be counted.

If a voter or voter's minor child is hospitalized due to a medical emergency on Election Day, you should contact the Board of Elections. Voters with such an emergency may apply for an absentee ballot until 3:00 p.m. on Election Day.

Directions to the Board of Elections:

Rt.129 to Hampshire Drive. Turn left on Princeton Road, and the Board of Elections is located at the end of the road on the right, directly in front of the County Care Facility.
